Spiritual Director's Corner

Reflecting on a Bread and Water Kind of Year . . .

Has it really been a year since we journeyed together with a band of pilgrims or caterpillars and feasted on an indescribably wonderful 72-hour experience?

The time apart is lamentable; but be encouraged that God has been at work in our community even in adversity. At times it has seemed like a bare-bones journey with rations of bread and water, yet . . .

Though all would agree that Zoom meetings can be awkward, and we prefer in-person gatherings, NCEC hosted six virtual gatherings during our pandemic isolation. Between June 2020 and this past February, more than eighty community members attended one or more virtual 4th day gatherings at various times. Wrestling with technology has not been easy, but our music and media teams have been adaptable and gracious in online settings. As a bonus, we have gained valuable technical experience that may strengthen our 4th-day connections in the future. Despite limitations, brothers and sisters in Christ have gathered online for friendly banter, infectious laughter, singing, prayer, 4th-day testimonies, devotionals, and love feasts or holy communion. Let's give thanks!

Love feasts seemed more difficult for engagement than Holy Communion. However, we accepted what was in our hands, simple bread and water, and used these symbols to celebrate the faith in and rich love of Christ we share. We realized that God's Spirit was present even on Zoom as we saw love glowing on beloved faces, the lifting of hands in praise, and heads bowed in prayer. The Love feasts reminded us that we share a deep bond in Jesus Christ, the Bread of Life and Living Water. For an Emmaus community to connect, experience God's presence, and respond to Him in this time of adversity is a stunning reality and a mark of grace, perseverance, and spiritual growth! Let's praise God!

Due to the pandemic limitations, we have become more aware of the vital need for reunion groups and other means of growth and encouragement in our 4th-day journeys. (See Conrad's newsletter article on 4th days and reunion groups.) Friends and loved ones have suffered this past year, and community members have been spurred on to "stir" God's love into our community. They have cared for those in need, driven miles to comfort the bereaved, shared the hope of salvation/healing, and lifted countless prayers. Many have sent encouraging cards and texts and posted prayers and words of encouragement on our Facebook page. We celebrate the gifts of grace that God has lavished upon us through others during this "bread and water" season.

We thank God for the faithful hearts that have persevered, listened to God's voice, and loved well. Our Emmaus community has had to work the hard ground of adversity, but I believe seeds have been planted, and we will see fruit come forth in the 4th days ahead. Australian author and speaker Christine Caine reminds us, "Sometimes when you find yourself in a dark place you think you've been buried, but you've actually been planted." As Easter people, we trust that what was buried this past year will burst forth into fruit in the 4th days ahead. God has not been dormant during this season! Ephesians 1:19 - 20 confidently proclaims that the same power that raised Jesus from the dead is at work in us--even in a pandemic season!

Women's Walk #103 - Lay Director

Greetings my brothers and sisters in Christ!

Lately, I feel like I have struggled to maintain the course. For example, I have struggled to maintain my daily obedience to study, something that has so profoundly changed my life that I can't believe I would ever push it to the side. I have struggled to write this note to you all, but I felt a nudge to trust today's devotionals.

From "Streams in the Desert" March 16, the scripture reads: "For our good." Hebrews 12:10. This devotional says, "the blossom is never as beautiful, or the perfume as fragrant, as when they are found blooming in the canyon".

From "The Real-Life Devotional Bible for Women" Day 75, The Prayer of Jabez. 1 Chronicles 4:10 with reference to Luke 18:1 where Jesus tells us to "always pray and not give up" and Philippians 4:6 where He tells us "Do not be anxious about anything but in every situation by prayer, and with thanksgiving, to present your requests to God".

These devotionals led me to these thoughts:

- 1. Although we/I have been in a "canyon" for over a year, the signs of rebirth, awakening, love and life are apparent everywhere. HALLELUJAH!!
- 2. There have been a lot of nights I woke up at 3 am and could not sleep. So, I prayed sometimes thanking Him for everything I am grateful for and for healing, and peace and comfort for many of you. I may not have been consistent in my studies, but I have spent more time in prayer for my family, my Emmaus community and my brothers and sisters in Christ than ever before in my life.
- 3. I have prayed the Prayer of Jabez for years after reading a book explaining it. It helped me to let go of my guilt in asking God for things, to ask him to provide ministry opportunities and to never give up but to give "it" to Him and to not be anxious. I have learned to recognize when I am trying to be in control and instead, to lay it down with thanksgiving. Beautiful things happen every single time I fully give "it" to God and walk in 100% faith vs carrying my burdens like a pack horse and allowing my heart to become weak with discouragement.
- 4. The struggle was real. Our Father was furthering my dependence on Him and showing me an opportunity to serve others (my prayers) even from a "canyon".

I have new eyes that have come from a long 15 months in the canyon and pray I never take our churches and our Emmaus community for granted again. I hope to see you soon, especially in September. Please keep your Emmaus leadership and upcoming pilgrims in your prayers!

An Experience in the Emmaus Tradition For 60 and Older

Face to Face is designed and developed by the Upper Room. It is designed to challenge and equip pilgrims for Christian Action. This short course in Christianity will help pilgrims to

become more effective disciples of Jesus Christ and actively engage in God's mission in the world.

This program is for persons 60 and older who have never been on a Walk to Emmaus. It was developed for this age group because their health risks and energy levels require a longer schedule with shorter sessions. It is tailored to meet senior men and women on their terms. Men and women will be together in the conference room.

The eight sessions will offer 15 talks about God's love and grace. The sessions will offer exciting and hospitable opportunities for Christian learning. There will be tasty refreshments, lots of laughs, surprising personal encounters, and spiritual experiences. There will be worship, communion, singing, joking with one another, and simply experiencing an avalanche of God's grace and love.


Kairos has been shut down since March 2020 and at this time does not appear that the Department of Corrections is willing to let Kairos back into the Prison system in 2021.

With that being said, Kairos of Alabama is in the process of Fundraising and Recruiting for the possibility of Starting-up in 2022. Our local Kairos programs are Limestone CF and North Alabama Community Work Center (formerly called Decatur Work Release). These two programs usually work together for a common goal: To establish and develop a Christian Community inside Alabama Prisons. Julia Tutwiler Woman's Prison in Wetumpka AL. is the women's prison that Kairos frequently visits; there has been no movement there since March 2020 according to Ruth Smith who has been tasked to lead the next Weekend.

In the interim, Kairos has participated in several special events to stay involved in developing and encouraging inside the Prisons. The most recent event was held on March 6, 2021. The Kairos Community had a Breakfast-Recruiting-Fundraising-Encouraging Video Production Celebration from 8:30- 12 noon at a local church in Hazel Green. The event consisted of forty Kairos members and future members and we produced three Encouraging Videos to send to the men inside these Prisons.

God's Special Time





Sponsorship—The Most Important Job of All

Sponsorship is the foundation of a healthy, effective Emmaus movement that is fulfilling its true purpose - the development of Christian leaders to strengthen our local churches.

A "sponsor" is one who takes responsibility for another. The suffix "ship" refers to the skill involved in the activity. Sponsorship is the skill of taking responsibility for another. First and foremost, it requires prayer. Sponsorship is a dynamic partnership between you and God. It will also require your time, energy and dedication.

The sponsorship process begins with prayer. Commit the process to God and rely upon Him to direct you to the individual or couple. You must be open and available to allow God to work through you.

It is important to remember that not everyone is an appropriate sponsor choice. A person with beliefs about God, Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit that differ from the traditional Christian belief of the Holy Trinity would not be a good sponsor choice. The walk is designed to bring together the body of Christ and controversy over doctrine can lead to divisiveness during the walk. Persons in the middle of an emotional crisis, such as a family breakup or severe grief, or that are psychologically unstable, also should not be considered. Pray for guidance when these circumstances appear to be present.

Those to consider for sponsorship include individuals and couples that are willing to grow and move forward in their journey of faith. They know that God can and has made a difference in their lives and they exhibit an excitement about being a Christian. Another example of those to consider for sponsorship are those that are already leaders in their church, including clergy - those that receive joy from serving God in the little ways and willingly do whatever is asked of them.

This is not a quick and easy process and should not be taken lightly. It may take a long time before you have a response from God about who you should sponsor. Don't be discouraged. God's timing is always perfect.

The aim of sponsorship is to bring spiritual revitalization to Christians who will bring new life and vision to the church, congregation, home, workplace, and community - to build up the body of Christ.

72-Hour Prayer Tips

Often when passing around the 72-Hour Prayer Vigil for an Emmaus Walk or Chrysalis Flight we hear, "I can't pray for a whole half-hour." You'd be surprised how fast that half-hour can go! Following are some tips to help you focus your

prayers during your commitment time. Use this as a guide but don't limit your prayer time to just these tips. Begin by scanning the list and marking those items that touch you the most. These are the prayer points that the Spirit has led you too. Don't feel pressured to pray the whole list; trust that God will lead others to pray and He will cover all the points on the list (and more). As you begin to pray for the items you marked, pause at each one and ask God what He would have you specifically pray about that point. When you can think of no more then move to the next item. If you should finish your list before your time is up, then go back and pray about the ones you did not mark. You may want to make these "bullet" prayers as you read down the list. You'll be amazed at how long you can actually pray when you commit yourself to giving the time! At the end you'll find that you were a blessing to others and received a great blessing yourself as well.

Pray for the Pilgrims/Caterpillars:

- Pray for them individually if you know their names or as a group.
- Pray that walls would come down and hearts would be opened to understand the depth, the height, the breadth, and width of God's love for them.
- Pray that each participant would receive a personal touch from God during his or her journey.
- Pray for the participants to be able to leave the world behind and give themselves to the weekend.
- Pray for the families of the participants.
- Pray protection for the participants as they leave the weekend behind and face the world again.
- Pray that they will carry the weekend with them into their world.

Pray for the Team Members:

- Pray for them individually if you know their names or as a group: Meal Service, Logistics,
 Conference Room, Agape, Worship, Events, etc.
- Pray that each team member would serve with humility and grace.
- Pray that each team member would receive a renewed touch from God as they see the weekend through the eyes of those experiencing it for the first time.
- Pray for the specific duties of teams that you may have participated in working with before. No one knows how hard it is or what could go wrong better than those who have experienced it!
- Pray for protection and strength.
- Pray that grace would abound when hiccups occur...and they always occur.

Pray for Defining Moments:

- Think back to your walk/flight and those events that meant the most to you...your defining moment. Allow God to take you back to that time.
- Pray for each participant out of the heart of this memory.
- Pray for the little moments that no one thinks gets noticed but might mean the world to someone else.
- Pray for the weekend.
- Pray that God is glorified by His will and ways being done.
- Pray for protection over the weekend, the grounds, and the people.
- Pray for the community as they gather to support special events.
- Pray that God's Spirit and Truth would abound.
- ♣ Pray the Lord's Prayer and think about how you could specifically apply moments of the weekend to it. Example: "...daily bread" Pray that the Bread of Life be broken and received with each talk.
- ♣ Pray about the moments of Communion /Lord's Supper. Pray for mealtimes and snack times. Pray that when it is over everyone involved will be able to say, "I came looking for Jesus and found Him here.

From the Archives

Walk to Emmaus Beginnings...



The Walk to Emmaus is an adaptation of the Roman Catholic Cursillo (pronounced cur-SEE-o) Movement, which originated in Spain in 1949. Cursillo de Cristianidad means "little course in Christianity." The original Cursillo leaders designed the program to empower persons to transform their living and working environments into Christian environments.

During the 1960s and 1970s, the
Episcopalians and Lutherans, along with
several nondenominational groups, such as
Tres Dias, began to offer Cursillo. In 1978,
The Upper Room of the General Board of
Discipleship adapted the program for a
primarily Protestant audience and began to
offer it under the name The Upper Room
Cursillo. In 1981, The Upper Room
made further adaptations and changed the
name of the program to The Upper Room

Walk to Emmaus. In 1984, The Upper Room developed a youth expression of Emmaus called Chrysalis. In 2015, Face to Face began "Encounters" in Emmaus Communities across the United States.
