

A MESSAGE FROM OUR COMMUNITY SPIRITUAL DIRECTOR BILL ALEXANDER

Last Fall I was asked to allow my name to be put in nomination as clergy on our community board of directors. Even though I wanted to say no, I could feel the Lord. I asked for time to pray about it, but I already knew what I needed to say. Several days later, I consented to the nomination.

I was told that Carol Goforth would be nominated as Community Spiritual Director. I looked forward to working with her and learning from her since she had much more experience in our community. Alas, God had other plans, and He called her home.

The Board of Directors then asked me to serve as Community Spiritual Director. It is a huge privilege, and great responsibility and I am deeply honored that our community has asked me to serve in this position.

Several years ago, a friend of mine told me about the Walk to Emmaus. It sounded interesting to me and as I kept asking questions, he asked me if I would be willing to help with a Walk since there is often a shortage of clergy. When I agreed, he told me that to work a Walk I had to go on one as a pilgrim first. So, I agreed to go on the Walk, but I thought to myself that I didn't need it. I graduated college with a Biblical Studies degree, graduated seminary, and had been a pastor for 18 years.

While my Walk was interesting, moving, and even convicting, I didn't think it was life changing. It was only later that I began to realize how life changing it actually was. The Walk planted the seeds that grew as time passed. I have often thought that had I not stayed active in a reunion group that held me accountable those seeds may well have died.

If I were asked to list the things that were the most important to spiritual growth I would start with regular church attendance, regular Bible reading and study, then an accountability group. I cannot overemphasize the importance and necessity of a reunion group or accountability group. Your group does not have be just people who have been on a Walk, they just need to be people who will be open and honest with you and you with them.

Do you want to keep the fire of the Walk to Emmaus? A reunion or accountability group is a necessity. If you are not involved in one, ask for help to find one or to start your own. This is very important, and we'll be glad to help.



Chrysalis is designed for youth in grades 8 thru 12. At this age, young people are making major decisions about religion, lifestyle, vocation, and lifelong relationships.

Chrysalis challenges them to grow not only in mind and body but also in spirit and faith. The Chrysalis weekend events, referred to as

Flights, are offered separately for girls and boys to allow youth freedom to explore their relationship with God without worrying about how they may appear to the other gender. It provides an opportunity outside their local congregations or youth groups to grow in their faith alongside their peers.

The New Covenant Community has been blessed to include the Chrysalis experience for youth in our area for over 25 years.




Like Emmaus, a Kairos weekend runs Thursday through Sunday and is held at the facility hosting the Kairos weekend.

The talks given on a weekend are tailored for those incarcerated (e.g. Choices, rather than Priorities), and due to the time constraints that a prison must have for safety, there are only eleven talks given, with an additional four talks given on a follow up weekend.

There are Kairos weekends for men, for women, and Kairos Outside caters to the women impacted by having their loved ones incarcerated. The north Alabama region has two Kairos Communities, North Alabama Work Release Center - aka Decatur Work Release - and Limestone. There is also a Kairos Outside community that serves the northern half of Alabama, as well as a Kairos community that serves the women's facility at Tutweiler.

Women's Walk to Emmaus#115 Krishna Gehrs, Lay Director


Hello family! What an amazing experience this past year of preparation has been! God has proven He is so faithful. He just wants our surrender and trust.

WHAT IS FACE TO FACE?

An Experience in the Emmaus Tradition, Faceto-Face is designed and developed by the Upper Room. It is designed to challenge and equip Pilgrims for Christian Action. This short course in Christianity will help Pilgrims to become more effective disciples of Jesus Christ and actively engage in God's mission in the world. This program is for persons 60 and older, or those who are physically unable to attend a

walk in the camp setting. It was developed for this group because their health risks and energy levels require a longer schedule with shorter sessions. It is tailored to meet senior men and women on their terms. Men and women will be together in the conference room. The four sessions will offer 15 talks about God's love and grace. The sessions will offer exciting and hospitable opportunities for Christian learning. There will be tasty refreshments, lots of laughs, surprising personal encounters, and spiritual experiences. There will be worship, communion, singing, joking with one another, and simply experiencing an avalanche of God's grace and love. Face to Face allows participants the opportunity to rediscover Christ's presence in their life, gain fresh understanding of God's transforming grace, and to form friendships that foster faith and support spiritual maturity. Many have been blessed who would never had the opportunity to attend a walk otherwise due to age or physical impairments.

FACE TO FACE ENCOUNTER #10 Janet Vader, Lay Director


It's that time again for the next Face to Face Encounter. Brought to you by the New Covenant Emmaus Community.

Why Do We Always Begin Worship at 7:29 PM? Jack Lawrence

The meeting time and date for the monthly gatherings was decided in early 1994 at the very first meeting of the Steering Committee for the proposed new Walk To Emmaus community, soon to be officially named the "New Covenant Emmaus Community".

The committee was made up of a handful of volunteers with experience in either the Nashville or Alabama Emmaus communities, and we met in Pulaski, Tennessee. Keeping in mind that in those days there was no electronic means (email, Facebook, etc.) to gain and maintain contact with members of the community, communication depended on occasional "snail-mail" newsletters. Knowing that it was important to minimize any changes, the committee made some concrete decisions (after much discussion!) about location and date/time for monthly Gatherings. For the first dozen years or so our Gatherings were held at St Andrew's Memorial UMC in Pulaski, and always on the third Friday evening of the month, worship to begin promptly at 7:29 PM. Credit goes to the wisdom of committee member Rev Russ Cain (our first Community Spiritual Director), who pointed out that making it an unusual time would keep folks from forgetting when to show up. Arriving earlier to fellowship and share dinner or snacks was always an option, but at 7:29 we stopped what we were doing and began to worship!

So, for the next 29 years we have continued to center our focus on Jesus when the clock is one tick shy of 7:30.

Pretty good tradition, huh?





One of the notable stories concerning Jesus is found in Luke 24:13-35, which serves as the scriptural basis for the Walk to Emmaus weekend. This narrative not only recounts a post-resurrection appearance of Jesus but also illustrates themes of discipleship and spiritual companionship. In this passage, two individuals are walking together, reflecting on their recent experiences and attempting to make sense of them collectively. During their journey, they are joined by Jesus, who appears to them as a stranger and imparts teachings.

A couple of the talks we hear during an Emmaus weekend discuss the significance and functioning of Group Reunions. Additionally, we hear about how spiritual companions serve as a means of grace. The narrative in Luke, along with other related stories, emphasizes that individuals are not intended to undertake their spiritual journey in isolation, but rather to continue it in the company of others who share similar paths.

Group Reunions are a crucial aspect of maintaining the experience of our 4th Day. They provide us with an opportunity to reflect on our spiritual journey with Jesus in the presence of others. These gatherings occur in a confidential and non-judgmental environment where we can receive prayer support and companionship during challenging times, as well as share in each other's successes when circumstances are favorable.

Additionally, they offer a platform for mutual learning and accountability while fostering a connection to Christ.

In the same manner as depicted in the story of Luke, whenever we gather together, Jesus is present to teach and guide us. He may also reveal Himself in a refreshing manner through a Group Reunion. I strongly encourage you to either join an existing Group Reunion or establish one of your own. This can be conducted in person or through any suitable format such as Zoom or Google Meets. The key is to maintain regular meetings and to engage honestly, utilizing the Group Reunion cards provided as the structure for the meeting.
